Margaret O'Connor, Ph.D. is an Associate Professor of Neurology at Harvard Medical School where she is the Director of Neuropsychology. She is the Co-Chair of the Medical & Scientific Committee of the Alzheimer's Association of Massachusetts and served on the Board of the Asperger/Autism Network. Dr. O'Connor conducts research on amnesia, ECT, TMS, delirium, and driving, and she has been an INS Member-at-Large, member of the INS Educational Task Force, Clinical Case Editor for the *INS Newsletter*, and served on numerous INS Program Committees.

Celiane Rey-Casserly, Ph.D. directs the Center for Neuropsychology and Clinical Neuropsychology Postdoctoral Fellowship Program at Boston Children's Hospital, holds a faculty appointment at Harvard Medical School, and is on staff at the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute. Miriam Beauchamp, Ph.D. is Associate Professor in neuropsychology at the University of Montreal (Canada) and a developmental neuropsychologist in the fields of traumatic brain injury (TBI), neuroimaging, and social cognition with an Adjunct appointment at McGill University. She conducts research at the Ste-Justine Hospital Research Center and is a consulting editor of *Neuropsychology* and ad hoc reviewer for *JINS*. In 2015, Dr. Beauchamp was awarded the INS Early Career Award.



Ashok Jansari, Ph.D. is a Senior Lecturer at Goldsmiths, University of London. His research explores Accelerated Long-term Forgetting (ALF), variation in face-processing ability from prosopagnosia to super-recognition, and assessment of executive functions. In 2008 he received a Media Fellowship from the British Association for the Advancement of Science. Mieke Verfaellie, Ph.D. is a Senior Research Career Scientist at the VA Boston Healthcare System and Professor of Psychiatry at Boston University School of Medicine. Her research has focused on patients with focal amnesia as a model system for understanding memory disorders and the cognitive and neural architecture of memory. She serves as Associate Editor for *JINS* and *Cognitive Neuropsychology*, and has served on the editorial board of *Neuropsychologia*, *Neuropsychology*, and *Brain and Cognition*.
